We had lots of fun over the Christmas Periods.



Inspections

The home has recently received inspections from numerous departments over the past few months. The first inspection we received was from the CQC inspector. They arrived on the home on the 4th December 2013. The visit was due to an unannounced routine inspection and they looked at five areas. These areas consisted of Consent to Care and Treatment, Care and Welfare of People Who use Services, Cleanliness and Infection Control, Requirements Relating to workers and Records. It is my pleasure to advise you that the outcome of this visit was that we are Meeting The Standard. The second visit from Worcestershire Infection Control Team. They came to undertake a thorough inspection of the home and the cleanliness of all areas. The inspector left no table and chair unturned and again the result was a positive report. Our third and final inspection was by the Worcestershire Contracts and Quality Assurance Team. The purpose of the visit was to look at the Health and Safety within the home and to ensure that we are meeting all standards set by the CQC and local authority and of course I'm sure your not shocked to hear that this resulted in a positive report once again for the home.
